

I've surveyed the woods at Twinberrow a few times and can still see extensive activity and a lot of bold young moving around. The total off the hill was 261 with 49 of those coming from Twinberrow. Sadly last year we had 2 traps stolen from Twinberrow, there is a thin chance badgers were responsible but most likely human interference. We will begin trapping again in February and will notify you once the traps are set to trap again.

Tomorrow's (9th January) forecast with a strong cold wind means excellent conditions for a drey disturbance so we will be up there tomorrow (9th January) if that's ok with you? Apologies for the short notice, a lot hinged on changing weather and availability of volunteers as I wanted to cover Twinberrow on a weekday as there will be less people around. The risk assessment is attached and, as always, all shooters have been vetted, and their SGC / FAC & insurance verified.

I had an idea for an art / educational installation in the woods, using a selection of varnished (non-toxic) squirrel damaged branches to create a fence / mini maize with an information board explaining the effects the greys have on the woodland, what do you / the community think?
