

Long Street Car Park, Dursley

Frequently Asked Questions

Will the car park be free to use?

Dursley Town Council have agreed not to charge for parking. Penalty charges will be issued for anyone overstaying the restrictions.

There are no current plans to review charging.

How long can I park for?

The car park is a designated “long stay” car park. You are permitted to stay for a maximum of 23 hours, with no return within one hour of leaving the car park.

The car park is open 24 hours each day, 7 days a week.

If I overstay how much is the parking charge?

The charge for overstaying is £70 payable within 28 days by the registered owner of the vehicle. All vehicular movements are filmed by the Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) camera.

Who enforces the restrictions?

Dursley Town Council have appointed District Enforcement Ltd as our parking management provider. Current legislation does not permit Town Councils to carry out this duty “in-house”.

Will the car park be available to local residents?

Yes - the car park is available to all users including visitors, walkers, business owners, traders, employees and local residents.

Can I get a permit to park?

The Town Council have decided not to issue any permits for parking but have committed to reviewing the car park usage during the first year of it being in operation.

Why does the entrance have a height restriction?

The barrier is in place to prevent large and unauthorised vehicles accessing the car park. Only light vehicles are permitted to use the car park.

Does the car park have CCTV?

Yes - the car park is fully covered by the Town Council's CCTV system.
