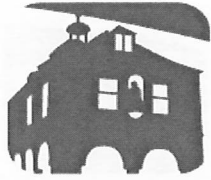
TRANQUILITY

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BEAUTY

The green slopes down towards Dursley's most beautiful building - the old Priory - and forms a beautiful tree-lined greenward in a vital location at the entry to Dursley on the Cotswold Way.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

It is a designated Town Green, Dursley's first and only.

RECREATIONAL USE

At all times of day people are seen walking dogs, kicking footballs, enjoying the view & quietly enjoying the peaceful ambience. This has been the case for decades.

TRANQUILLITY

One summer evening, for instance, the peace, greenery, wildlife, brilliant light reflected off the Priory and outlook up to the treetops are as tranquil as you can get in Dursley.

WILDLIFE

Bodgers, foxes and small mammals are often seen there, bats fly across to the trees on the other side. There are orchids in the grass, there are birds all around.
