Future Dursley Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

Record of consultation event: Littlecombe Drop in Event 9th July at Dursley Community Centre 6.30pm -8.30pm. This was a joint event held with Cam Parish Council.

Aim of consultation event:

- To enable residents to comment on plans for the next stage of the Littlecombe development.
- To use this event as another opportunity to raise and increase awareness of Future Dursley
- To seek views of local residents on the draft vision and objectives and potential development sites for Dursley.

At the Community Centre

Display boards with the Draft Vision and Objectives and a blank A1 sheet for local residents to add their comments on these using post it notes were available to view. **No comments were made on the draft vision and objectives.**

Proposed development sites

There were nine A4 size site assessments with the name, size, photo and suggested development proposals for sites. Individuals were asked to comment on the proposed developments and make additional suggestions.

Site no 4 Land at the Bottom of Long Street

'There are too many dwellings in too small a space, too high and not enough parking spaces.'

Site no 9 Bus station

'How will bus passengers (many unable to walk far) access doctors' surgery and library if buses do not come to the bus station?'

'The day centre 15, May Lane already suffers from a lack of customers as buses are constantly changed. Do you want to close a 60 year old facility?'

Site no 10 Fields at the back of Shakespeare Road

'No building at Shakespeare Road as this is outside the build boundary'.

Site no 21 Land off Hardings Drive

'It is sometimes impossible to get through May Lane from Hardings Drive. More houses will lead to more cars and more congestion'.



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Site no 22 Land behind the Old Bell and Dil Raj

'This site is unsuitable for housing as access on to Long Street is unsuitable with poor or no visibility'.
