New Petanque Court Opens

We are pleased to announce that the installation of a Petanque Court at the War Memorial Recreation Ground is complete. The court was officially opened by the Mayor on 22nd October 2019.



The facility is free to use and will be run on a turn up and play basis. If required, players can borrow Boules from 'The Pulse' in return for a refundable deposit.

The court was installed with the help of a Sports England grant which covered 50% of the costs. It's a great addition to our leisure facilities and provides another way in which our residents can remain active.

Local resident and keen Petanque player, John Roberts, approached the Town Council with a proposal for a Petanque Terrain in Dursley. He said "Petanque, also known as Boules is immensely popular, played all over the world and there is a thriving Petanque scene in the UK (with over 170 clubs registered with Petanque England) and countless more in pubs, clubs and parks.

The game is one of the most inclusive activities available where people of all ages, gender, ability and fitness can participate equally together. It is simple to learn, involving gentle exercise, played as singles, doubles or a triple game. It provides numerous benefits including health, social and physical. It can be played one-to-one or in teams of two or three. It is played with hand-sized hollow metal boules on various types of dirt or gravel surfaces (terrains) the object of the sport is to get as many of your team's boules closer to a small wooden target (jack) than that of your opponents.

In Dursley, there are existing groups of players (e.g Dursley Rotary Team) who have had to play out of the area. Over time we would like to set up a Cam and Dursley Boules Club. We will be offering some taster sessions to attract players, families and club competitions".

Fly Tipper Caught on CCTV Dumping Waste in War Memorial Recreation Ground

In September, our CCTV cameras captured clear images of a fly tipper dumping waste in the War Memorial Recreation Ground.

Working with Stroud District Council, the offender was successfully identified and issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice for £150, which was subsequently paid.

Councillor Alex Stennett, Chair of the Council Green Spaces Committee, said "fly tipping is an unnecessary and unpleasant activity in this modern age so I am reassured that we can work with Stroud District Council to bring offenders to task."

Councillor Doina Cornell, Stroud District Council Leader commented that "it's just not acceptable for people to dump rubbish in this way – they need to realise that there are proper ways to dispose of waste and that their actions could land them in trouble."

Councillor Simon Pickering, Stroud District Council's Environment Committee Chair commented that "this is great partnership work between town and district councils - together we can stamp out this unacceptable behaviour."

In October 2019 we agreed grant awards totalling over £19k, supporting 15 organisations. The smallest grant awarded was £100 the largest was £5,000.

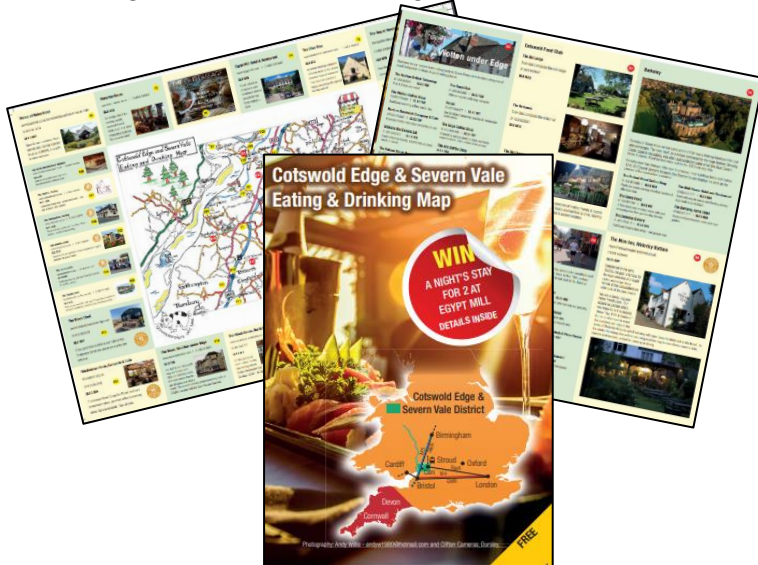
We are committed to providing assistance and support to local community groups which are set up to promote community life for Dursley residents.

A Light Bulb Moment – Thank You

At the 2019 Annual Assembly members of the public were asked to submit ideas on how they would improve Dursley.

The Residents Suggestion scheme was open until the end of August and we would like to thank all those who submitted ideas.



The Council's Green Spaces Committee and Policy and Finance Committee considered 20 suggestions during their meetings in September and October.

As a result, some of the ideas have been forwarded to Stroud District Council for their consideration e.g.

Tidy the area of the lay-by and steps at Highfields Approach and Rosebery Mount (Fly-tipping).

Co-working space for small and micro businesses and also for self-employed people.

Other ideas will be considered by the Town Council in more detail e.g.

We supported the suggestion for Silver Street – to create a speed table (similar to Sainsbury's in Castle Street) and will continue to liaise with Highways.

As suggested, we have purchased new watering cans for Kingshill Cemetery.
